### **Kansas Homeland Security and Defense mapping Tool – The Adjutant General’s Department**

Project Cost: \$412,500

#### Project Objectives

The Kansas Homeland Security and Defense Mapping Tools objectives were to:

- Develop web-based GIS tool(s) for Kansas Department of Health and Environment (KDHE) Bio-Terrorism (BT) section to help administer and report local and state bio-terrorism preparedness status
- Enhance existing health facility information regulated by KDHE with spatial data for use in geographic information systems
- Establish secure, reliable information technology infrastructure to take full advantage of distributed GIS capabilities and communication between the Adjutant General’s Department, the Department of Health and Environment, and the State’s Data Access and Support Center
- Develop training resources for crisis response support staff and user community on GIS products, procedures, tools, and analytical concepts
- Establish web-based data development and maintenance infrastructure at DASC to aid local agencies with limited or no GIS capabilities to provide locally maintained data needed for emergency response
